At the Fourth edition of "Stupefatte Visioni di Natura – Theatre, art and Veneto culture evenings" Santa Margherita is the sponsor of the show "Il Servitore a Tavola – Commedia con Lazzi e Prosecco"

The season of theatre review and Veneto culture events known as "Stupefatte visioni di natura", which recalls a verse by the poet Andrea Zanzotto, continues in Refrontolo. Santa Margherita confirms its desire to support the best of local culture with its sponsorship of an event in the Fourth edition.

A show is scheduled in the grounds of Villa Spada on Sunday 6th July 21.00h, whose title "il Servitore a Tavola – Commedia con Lazzi e Prosecco" is uniquely tied to Santa Margherita, the first Italian wine producer to have experimented, increasingly successfully, with Prosecco spumante wine production since way back in 1952.

With the aim of promoting artistic initiatives and traditions from the territory in which it operates, Santa Margherita is putting its name on this theatre piece, a reworking of the famous play "Il Servitore di Due Padroni" by Carlo Goldoni, with all-female protagonists. The version "with prosecco" is inspired by the first testimonies of custom reflected by the theatre and by late Seventeenth Century Venetian literature.

Sponsorship extends also to the exhibition of painter Emma Ciardi at Molinetto della Croda, with forty paintings, lent by private collectors, highlighting a small selection of artworks actually created on the Refrontolo hill.

Here in the heart of the Prosecco di Conegliano-Valdobbiadene DOCG production zone, Santa Margherita has an estate which is yielding its first recognised fruits and whose standard bearer is Prosecco Superiore "Rive di Refrontolo" Brut Valdobbiadene DOCG.

The final toast of the evening will bear the Santa Margherita hallmark, with a selection of wines paired with food inspirations from Enoteca Eccellentissimo (Treviso).
